Feline Neuter

What is a Neuter (Orchidectomy)?

A neuter involves removal of both testicles. This is done by making one or two small incisions through the scrotum. All cats are sent home with pain control medication. Most animals tolerate this procedure well and return to their normal activity within 1-2 days. We recommend keeping a cone on for at least 7-10 days post surgery to prevent bleeding and/or infection.

Why is it important to get my cat Neutered?

Benefits of a neuter include:

- Decrease unwanted pregnancies and surplus animal population
- Prevent prostate infections that can be fatal
- Prevent testicular cancer
- Decrease marking, wandering, and territorial behaviors
- Decrease inter-animal aggression

We recommend neutering ALL cats at 6 months of age.

We often perform additional preventive medicine treatments at the same as the neuter while your cat is under anesthetic. These treatments can be included at an additional fee.
