Canine Neuter (< 10kg)

What is a Neuter (Orchidectomy)?

A neuter involves removal of both testicles. This is done through a small incision made just in front of the scrotum. All dogs are sent home with pain control medication. Most animals tolerate this procedure well and return to their normal activity within 2-3 days. We recommend keeping a cone on (or old pair of boxers) until the incision is fully healed, 2 weeks after surgery.

Why is it important to get my dog Neutered?

Benefits of a neuter include:

- Decrease unwanted pregnancies and surplus animal population
- Prevent prostate infections that can be fatal
- Prevent testicular cancer
- Decrease marking, wandering, and territorial behaviors
- Decrease inter-dog aggression

We recommend neutering ALL dogs from <10kg (22lb) at 6 months of age.

What is the cost of a Dog Neuter? (<10kg)

Other things that can be done at the time of Neuter

We often perform additional preventive medicine treatments at the same as the neuter while your dog is under anesthetic. These treatments can be included at an additional fee.

Preventive Treatments	Price Range
Vaccines <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DA2PPv (Distemper, Adenovirus, Parainfluenza, and Parvo viruses) • Rabies • Bordetella (“Kennel cough”) • Leptospirosis 	\$30 - \$40
External parasite (Flea/Tick) control <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bravecto (lasts for 3 months) • Revolution (lasts for 1 month) 	\$70 - \$80 \$30 - \$40
Internal parasite control <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drontal 	\$30 - \$70
Identification <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tattoo (visual ID that traces to our clinic) • Microchip (hidden ID that traces to an individual owner) 	\$40 \$55
Incision protection <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Onesie (recommended for spay procedures) 	\$40 - \$50
